**Press Release by Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA)**

**Flood bulletin as on 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2013**

As on today, 5476 people in four districts viz. Dhemaji, Lakhimpur, Jorhat & Golaghat have been affected by flood as per the reports of concerned district administrations. Three (3) relief camps in Dhemaji district are still operational with 528 camp inmates.

Flood has been reported from 9 Revenue Circles & 84 villages. The Revenue Circles affected are Jonai and Dhemaji under Dhemaji district; West Jorhat & Teok under Jorhat district and Golaghat, Dergaon & Morongi under Golaghat district. A total of 18 villages & 226 people have been affected in Dhemaji district; 29 villages & 2085 people have been affected in Jorhat district; 36 villages & 1735 people have been affected in Golaghat district. However, in Lakhimpur district only one village is reported to be flooded affecting only crop area.

As per CWC report, River Dhansiri (South) at two points viz. Numaligarh & Golaghat is flowing above the danger level.
