Animals Affected in National Parks	No report of any casualties of wildlife has been received from any of the Protected Areas during the past 24 hours. Patrolling by boats and on elephant back is being carried out round the clock to ensure strict vigil on poaching and on distressed animals. Overall situation is normal and under watch. **Press Release by Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA)**

**Flood bulletin as on 16<sup>th</sup> July, 2013**

As on today, Dhemaji, Dibrugarh, Jorhat and Nagaon districts are affected by floods. A total of 31174 people are affected in two districts of Dhemaji & Nagaon, while in Dibrugarh and Jorhat only crop area have been affected. Six (6) relief camps in Dhemaji district continue to be operational with 1237 camp inmates and 23630 persons in Samgauri Revenue Circle of Nagaon district are still in 24 temporary shelters.

The revenue circles affected are Dhemaji, Jonai and Sissiborgaon under Dhemaji district; Majuli under Jorhat district, Dibrugarh west revenue circle under Dibrugarh district and Samaguri under Nagaon district. A total of 42 villages and 7544 people have been affected in Dhemaji district; 12 villages and 23630 people have been affected in Nagaon district.

As per CWC reports the Brahmaputra is flowing above danger level at Nematighat (Jorhat) and Dhubri.
