Flood bulletin as on 19th July, 2013

The number of affected population as on today in three districts of Assam i.e. Dhemaji, Lakhimpur & Nagaon are 23, 831 & in Jorhat & Golaghat district, only crop areas have been affected as reported by the concerned district administrations. Nine (9) relief camps in Dhemaji district are still operational with 2078 camp inmates.

Flood has been reported from 10 revenue circles & 103 villages. The revenue circles affected are Dhemaji, Jonai, Gogamukh and Sissiborgaon under Dhemaji district, Majuli under Jorhat district, Samaguri under Nagaon district, Golaghat under Golaghat district & Narayanpur, Subansiri, Kadam under Lakhimpur district. A total of 68 villages and 16274 people have been affected in Dhemaji district; 9 villages and 3839 people have been affected in Nagaon district & 14 villages and 3718 people have been affected in Lakhimpur district as reported from the districts.

As per CWC report, following rivers are flowing above danger levels- river Brahmaputra at Nematighat (Jorhat), river Dhansiri at Numaligarh (Golaghat), river Jiabharali at NT Road Xing (Sonitpur) & Beki at Rd bridge, Barpeta.

North East Space Application Centre (NESAC) has also issued a low flood warning for North Lakhimpur, Subansiri, Kadam revenue circles of Lakhimpur district, which is valid till 18.45 hrs. of 20th July 2013.

Further, as per report from Chief Conservator of Forest no animal casualty have been reported from Kaziranga National Park, Nameri National Park, Dibru-Saikhowa National Park, Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary, Deepor Beel Wildlife Sanctuary & Amchang Wildlife Sanctuary.
