**Flood bulletin as on 25<sup>th</sup> July, 2013**

Flood situation in the State have improved significantly in the last 24 hrs. Population in only Dhemaji district is being affected as on today & in Lakhimpur, Nagaon and Jorhat district only crop areas have been affected as reported by the concerned district administrations. Nine (9) relief camps in Dhemaji district are still operational with 2,273 camp inmates.

Flood has been reported from 6 revenue circles & 49 villages. The revenue circles affected are Dhemaji, Jonai and Sissiborgaon under Dhemaji district, Majuli under Jorhat district, Samaguri under Nagaon district & Narayanpur under Lakhimpur district. A total of 25 villages and 4954 people have been affected in Dhemaji district.

As per CWC report, following rivers are flowing above danger levels- river Brahmaputra at Nematighat (Jorhat) & Dhubri and river Dhansiri (South) at Numaligarh (Golaghat).
