Flood bulletin as on 26th July, 2013

Population in two districts i.e. Dhemaji & Lakhimpur district is being affected as on today & in Jorhat district only crop areas have been affected as reported by the concerned district administrations. Nine (9) relief camps in Dhemaji district are still operational with 2,273 camp inmates.

Flood has been reported from 5 revenue circles & 41 villages. The revenue circles affected are Dhemaji, Jonai and Sissiborgaon under Dhemaji district, Majuli under Jorhat district & Kadam under Lakhimpur district. A total of 23 villages and 4554 people have been affected in Dhemaji district & 6 villages and 3500 people have been affected in Lakhimpur district.

As per CWC report, following rivers are flowing above danger levels- river Brahmaputra at Nematighat (Jorhat) & Dhubri and river Dhansiri (South) at Numaligarh (Golaghat).
