Erosion started on approaches on Dhemaji side of RCC BR.No.7/1 on khalihamari Butikur Road at Laumuri. The road surface also overtopped by flood water for a length of approx.. 7.00 M near the bridge approach. Temporary restoration is being done by providing bamboo palasiding and earth filled cement bags.</p> <p>2. Due to severe flood most of the roads and PMGSY schemes have been are damaged/affected. Several roads are either partially or fully submerged. Several road embankment have been eroded and approaches of bridge and culverts are washed away by the flood water. The actual quantum of flood damage/loss could be ascertained after receding of flood water. Detailed list of flood damaged schemes and approx. amount for repair and restoration will be submitted after receding of flood (PWD Rural Road).</p> <p>3. C/4/2000/691 on 29.06.2013. Leakage, seepage, occurred in between ch. 8th km to 10 th km and erosion occurred in between ch. 5th km & 8th km of Kumotiya R/B embankment.</p>
