Flood bulletin as on 30th July, 2013

As on today, 7971 population in four districts i.e. Dhemaji, Lakhimpur, Golaghat & Jorhat district is being affected by flood. Nine (9) relief camps in Dhemaji district are still operational with 2227 camp inmates.

Flood has been reported from 8 revenue circles & 55 villages. The revenue circles affected are Dhemaji, Jonai and Sissiborgaon under Dhemaji district; Majuli, West Jorhat and Teok under Jorhat district; Golaghat under Golaghat district & Kadam under Lakhimpur district. A total of 19 villages and 2648 people (in Jonai revenue circle only) have been affected in Dhemaji district; 1 village and 225 people have been affected in Lakhimpur district; 19 villages and 2943 people have been affected in Golaghat district. In Jorhat district 16 villages and 2155 people have been affected during the last 24 hrs. as reported by the concerned district administration.

As per CWC report, following rivers are flowing above danger levels- river Brahmaputra at Nematighat (Jorhat) & river Dhansiri (South) at Numaligarh (Golaghat).
